NEW PHONE SYSTEM – Ebenezer has unveiled our new phone system. There are new phones located in the food pantry. When you call in to the main line, you will be directed to press a button to reach your party directly. Choices are the pastor, the secretary, the treasurer, the food pantry, general information or weather-related announcements. Each party has their own voice mail, so will get your messages quicker. The phones also give us options to call/intercom between the buildings. When work is done in the narthex, there will also be a phone located there. One more step to make communication better.

BIBLE STUDY - Sunday Mornings in the Sanctuary. March 10th to April 21st from 9:45 AM to 10:45 AM. *Embracing the Uncertain*, invites us to engage and wrestle with life's uncertainties, not ignore them.
