
During 11:00 AM Worship on the

# Ash Wednesday March 1, 2017 At Ebenezer UMC 7:00 AM to 10:00 AM 3:00 PM to 9:00 PM

Lent, the period of 40 days before Easter (excluding Sundays), begins on <u>Ash</u> <u>Wednesday</u> and ends on Holy Saturday, the evening before Easter. During Lent, we enter into a season of preparation, self-reflection and repentance when we seek to literally "turn around" and realign our lives and focus toward God. It is a time to give up things as well as take on new life-giving practices, helping us rid ourselves of distractions and our own selfish desires. By doing so, we seek to live and love as more faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

The first day of Lent marks the beginning of a period of reflection and penance. In the Bible, sprinkling oneself with ashes was traditionally a sign of one's sorrow for having committed sins. In the Christian tradition, Ash Wednesday also marked the beginning of preparation for the understanding of the death and resurrection of Christ. The particular symbolism of ashes for this day comes from a practice in the Roman Catholic churches in which the ashes from the palms used in the preceding year's Palm Sunday celebration are blessed. With these ashes, the marks of a cross are placed on the forehead of each worshiper. This practice has become a part of Ash Wednesday in many United Methodist churches.

On Ash Wednesday, March 1, 2017, Ebenezer United Methodist Church will be open from 7:00 AM until 10:00 AM and again from 3:00 PM until 9:00 PM. During this time, you may stop in the sanctuary for the imposition of ashes, communion and to be in prayer. Lenten devotional materials will be available as well. Please join in this time of prayer as we begin the Lenten Season at Ebenezer United Methodist Church.

# Give Up Something Bad for Lent!

The practice of Lent can easily become routine and mechanical. We can go through the motions without letting them touch our hearts or change our lives. This Bible study will help you take time to make sure that as you give up something, you will gain much more.

During Lent each year, Christians give up something as an act of sacrifice and spiritual discipline. Often it is something like chocolate, knowing that after Easter Sunday they can once again enjoy what they have given up.

Theologian, James Moore, challenges us to take it further—to give up something spiritually that we would be better off not doing. He invites all to seek God's help to focus on eliminating one

habit or attitude that is destructive. Imagine giving up envy, jealousy, self-pity, apathy, procrastination, gossip, resentment, or negative thinking, how much better life would be.

All are invited to use the forty days of Lent as a time to give up something bad for Lent as a way of preparing to fully embrace the Good News of Easter. The Lenten Season begins on March 1, 2017. Take this time to prayerfully consider what Lent means to you, why it is important and why you think people often give up something for Lent. Then give up something bad for Lent. On March 26th, April 2nd and April 9th, we will gather during the Sunday School hour and explore together what the scriptures have to say to us about Lent and the Good News of Easter.



# MEET MATT AND JESS MIDDLETON

On Sundays, Matt and Jess Middleton can usually be found in the Sunday School nursery, where Jess is one of two nursery coordinators. The couple will be watching their own five-month-old son, Robbie, as well as any other babies and toddlers whose parents are attending worship and/or Sunday School.

The son of Ken and Kim Middleton, Matt is serving a three-year term on the Committee on Lay Leadership. Like his dad, he sings, though the new baby leaves him little time for it, but he can be heard playing trumpet with Ebenezer's instrumental group on occasion.

Matt, of course, grew up at Ebenezer, and Rev. Judy married him and Jess 18 months ago and baptized Robbie this past fall. The couple live in Westminster and the family includes Jess's two sons by her first marriage, Xander LeDuc, 10, and Sammy LeDuc, 8.
