## A Note from Your Pastor

When we think of Easter, what comes to mind? Worship? Sunrise Service? Egg hunts? Family gatherings? Food? Easter dress? Springtime? Biblically, the Easter Event (which includes the events of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday) is recorded in all four of the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, & John). This is one way the Gospel writers remind us of the importance of Jesus' death and resurrection.

Culturally, we tend to "tidy" up Easter and make it clean and pain free. We want to jump from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, from shouting "Hosanna! (Save us!) to "Alleluia! (He is risen!). For children, we tend to allow the focus of Easter to become more about the Easter Bunny than about Jesus' resurrection from the dead. As faithful Christian adults we should look at Easter from a spiritual perspective in order to see that Easter is the ultimate gift that God provides. In the resurrection of Jesus from the dead we are given new and eternal life, we are forgiven and are able to forgive and we are freed to live and love like Jesus.

The Easter Event is reason why the Church exists and the reason why we are able to receive the Holy Spirit for guidance in living and loving more like Jesus. Looking at Easter from a theological point of view should prompt us to exam our priorities and discern the things in our lives that need changing so that Easter becomes a higher priority for all of us and not a one-day celebration. The church is the place where all of us can find the support we need to live and love more like Jesus.

My hope and prayer is that we begin our Easter journey on Palm Sunday and follow the path of Jesus together through all of the events of Holy Week. By doing so, we will be better equipped to celebrate Easter everyday of the year; receiving new and eternal life, being forgiven, having the capacity to forgive and being free to live and love like Jesus. Now this is something to celebrate! Happy Easter!

# Annual Conference



# Stephen Ministers: The After People

People often ask, "What exactly is a Stephen Minister?"

Stephen Ministers are the After People.

Stephen Ministers are there:

... after the phone call you hoped you'd never get.

...*after* the funeral, when everyone has left and the emotions you've held at bay come crashing in on you.

... after the relationship falls apart and the bottom falls out of your life.

...*after* the doctor says, "I'm sorry, but there is nothing more we can do.

...*after* the nursing home director shakes your hand and says, "Welcome to your new home."

 $\dots$  after the last child honks the horn, waves, and drives away – and the house suddenly seems empty.

...*after* the gavel comes down, the handcuffs go on, and your loved one is led away.

...*after* the baby arrives, demanding more of you than you ever dreamed possible.

... after you find a pink slip with your final paycheck.

...*after* your family and friends have heard your story one too many times, but you still need to talk about it.

Stephen Ministers are the *After People*. They are ready to come alongside you – or your friends, neighbors, coworkers, or relatives – and provide comfort and support for as long *after* as needed.

Meet Rich and Cheri Holl



Although they just started attending Ebenezer in November and joined in February, Cheri has already jumped in to help with events. Cheri likes to bake, so has provided cakes for two memorial services and she attended the last Spring Fling meeting to get information on providing goodies for that event. Rich has been "threatened" by Pastor Judy with something to do. "When Judy found out I had been on the Board of Trustees at Linganore United Methodist, she said she had something in mind for me," Rich said.

The couple and their two children, Rachel, 25, and William, 21, joined EUMC after transferring from Linganore UMC, where they had been members since 2000. Prior to that, they had attended Flohrville UMC in Sykesville.

"The kids were baptized at Flohrville, but it was a small church with no children's programs and we decided we wanted our kids raised up in the church," Cheri said. So, they transferred to Linganore, where Rich was president of the Trustees for 12 years. Cheri worked on mission programs and was the Treasurer for two years. Unfortunately, Linganore's congregation is growing older and some programs have been dropped, so Rich and Cheri started looking for another church with active programs for them to participate in.

"We tried several other churches, and came here in November and instantly loved it," Cheri said. Perhaps Cheri, being a Poole and growing up in Winfield, had something to do with their decision as well. A sister and her grandparents are buried in Ebenezer's cemetery. "The Poole's were very active in the Winfield area," she said. Rich, however, is originally from New York City. "I grew up two blocks from Yankee Stadium," he said proudly, hence the worn Yankees jacket he wears.

The couple met through work, where both worked at Entenmann's bakery, now part of Bimbo Bakeries. In 1976, Rich requested a transfer from the Connecticut Depot to the Maryland Depot, becoming the first Route Sales Representative in this state. Cheri started working for Entenmann's in 1986 as a cashier/ assistant office manager.

The couple started dating in October 1988 and married April 22, 1990. As Rich said jokingly of their courtship, "That was because I was senior man and had top bid to date her." They then settled in Winfield.

Being 10 years older than Cheri, Rich could retire 14 years ago, but after seven years, Bimbo Bakeries asked him to come back and he worked another six years as warehouse manager before permanently retiring in December 2016 after the position was eliminated. Now, he's a house husband and "driving me nuts," said Cheri, who has been a payroll manager for Carroll County Government the last 24 years.

The couple's children are both in college. Rachel is a Certified Nursing Assistant and is going for her Licensed Practical Nurse degree at Carroll Community College. She also works for Target Industries, helping challenged clients. William, an Eagle Scout, is studying computer science at University of Maryland University College.

Rich and Cheri spend Sunday mornings in church and then relax with the family. Rich will watch his favorite sports teams on television (New York Yankees, Giants and Washington Capitals).


Cheri loves to read a variety of books and is heavily into genealogy, having traced some of her relations back to 1600s England. She also searches area cemeteries, where 25 Poole relatives lay in Linganore UMC's churchyard. On a trip to England in 2015, she found many Poole's, some whose names were found in the Tower of London after they had gotten on the wrong side of King Henry VIII.

Rich is half Italian, half German and Cheri wants to visit Germany to research his father's family, who were Presbyterian. Rich's Catholic maternal grandfather grew up near the Vatican, and on a 2013 trip to Rome, the couple were able to attend Pope Francis's first public address. "We landed on Palm Sunday and went in and they gave us palms and let us sit in the special seated area," Cheri said. "It was a very spiritual experience. The Italians were so nice, all the churches were open, they didn't care what religion you were, it was very open."

They've also traveled to Bermuda, the Dominican Republic and the Caribbean. As a minor league hockey player, Rich also traveled to other sites.

As Cheri loves to bake, naturally Easter is her favorite holiday. "My mother would make all kinds of candies for Easter," she said. For Rich, it meant a new suit. "Other kids got candy, I got a new suit," he said. "My mother said the candy is gone in a week, but the suit is forever."
