These are words that will be shared on Confirmation Sunday as some of our youth take the vows of membership on their own behalf.

This year we will offer a confirmation class for youth who are in 8<sup>th</sup> grade or above who have not yet been confirmed. Our class will meet during the Sunday school hour from 9:45 AM until 10:45 AM on Sunday mornings at the church. We will also meet at other specified times throughout the year. The youth will be confirmed on Pentecost Sunday, May 20, 2018 during worship. If your child is interested in participating in the confirmation class this year please complete a registration form and return it by August 15, 2017 with a check for \$50.00 made payable to Ebenezer UMC. This deposit will go toward the cost for the ROCK Event. If this expense creates a hardship for your family, please speak to Rev. Judy.


Ocean City Convention Center Ocean City, MD January 26 - 28, 2018



# Rev. Judy Emerson

In the Gospel according to Luke we hear: "But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." But the Lord answered her, "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; there is need of only one thing." Luke 10:40-42. In Luke we also hear the story of the Good Samaritan who helped a beaten stranger. At the end of the story Jesus commands the Jewish scholar who tested him to "Go and do likewise." Luke 10:37.

When we take a look at these two texts from the Gospel of Luke, it can be very confusing. Do we sit and listen or should we go out and get busy helping others? t first glance we get some mixed signals. Both texts center on responding to the message God brings to us as disciples of Jesus Christ. It is almost as if the story of Mary and Martha picks up where the Good Samaritan leaves off and finishes the story.



One story speaks of loving our neighbor, the other demonstrates how the word of the Lord is an expression of love for God in our busy world. Both stories give us an example for discipleship. They reveal to us that Jesus wants us to love God and our neighbor and to listen to God's word. This means that there will be times when we need to sit and listen as well as times when we need to act. Being a disciple is not one or the other, it involves listening, learning and serving.

As we approach the end of the summer months and the relaxing time it can bring, we are beginning a new school year together once again. As I started my 12th year as the pastor of Ebenezer this July, I began to pray about the many ways we will listen, learn and serve our Lord together during the rest of 2017 and into 2018. I am excited to say we will have many opportunities for all three. In September we will begin a class for youth in 8th grade and up who wish to be confirmed this year. We have an excellent leadership team in place and a wonderful group of youth who are ready to begin exploring what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. Parents, mentors and youth are invited to an informational meeting on Sunday, September 10th during Sunday School. We will meet in the sanctuary.

Our confirmands and other youth are invited to attend the ROCK RETREAT sponsored by the **Baltimore Washington** Conference of the UMC this year. Together we will travel to Ocean City, Maryland from January 26th - 28th, 2018 and spend the weekend learning about God's love for us. In October we will offer an adult bible study on the popular movie The Shack. On Friday, October 6th at 7:00 PM all participants are invited to meet in the sanctuary to watch the movie together. YES popcorn and snacks will be available! We will then meet during Sunday School for the next four weeks to discern together what God says to us through this film.

These are just a few of the many things happening at EUMC this fall. Jesus continues to invite us to sit at His feet to listen and to learn, showing us how to love God by loving ourselves and our neighbors. It is very easy for us to become distracted with the busy-ness of serving and overlook the necessity of seeking the Lord's guidance. I pray we will seek a balance between listening and serving in order that we may hear God's word, understand God's ways and respond to God's word!

# Treasurer Tidbits

Our 2016 Audit is complete and we received a very positive report from the Auditor with NO recommendations for the next year. YEAH!!! Thanks to all of you for helping me to keep the records and numbers in good shape. I'm thankful for all your support.

Here is some interesting information from Carroll County Food Sunday (CCFS)......They provide support to 58 individuals and families on a daily basis which includes milk vouchers, meat, eggs, tuna, cereal, soup, etc. They provide "veggie vouchers" ranging from \$5 to \$15 each week to be redeemed for fresh produce at participating farmers' markets throughout the county. For 19 years, the children at Runnymede Elementary School have participated in an annual "Food Sunday Walk". This year they presented CCFS with a check for \$10,316. Over the past 19 years, a staggering total of \$166,896 has helped fund the CCFS program. Ebenezer continues to support this very worthwhile effort each month of the year. To date this year we have donated \$1,271 to provide assistance to families in need.

Here are some fun Food Facts from CCFS:

A cluster of bananas is called a HAND.

The most popular spice is PEPPER.

Honeybees must visit TWO MILLION flowers to make a pound of honey.

The average American eats at McDonald's 1,810 times in his/her lifetime.


