As we are quickly approaching Holy Week, it is amazing to me to think that our 2018 Lenten Journey is almost over and we will soon be shouting Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed! After Easter Services have ended and our celebration of Easter with our families is over, I can't help but think about the song recorded by Clay Walker, *Then What?* In the lyrics we hear "Then what, what you gonna do when the new wears off and the old shines through?"

I guess this song kept coming to mind as I thought about Easter. Together we will make our way to Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and listen once again about Jesus' entry and the crowds shouting Hosanna! We will then travel to the Upper Room on Maundy Thursday with Jesus and his disciples. We will walk together to the foot of the cross on Good Friday and hear the final words of Jesus as he is paying in full for our sin that separates us from God. We will then move together to the empty tomb to hear again the experiences of the women who went there early on the first day of the week to find it empty. We will hear once more the words of the angels at the empty tomb "He is not here, but has risen" (Luke 24:6). When the celebration of the Day of Resurrection is over I can't help but ask, then what?

Easter is more than a one day or one-week experience. Easter is an everyday celebration in which we live by placing our trust in God, believing that Jesus is the resurrection and the life. We believe in the resurrection and we celebrate our belief together each year. Even though Easter is on April 1st this year, we know it is not a trick and there are no April Fool's Day jokes about it. He is risen! Even though scripture tells us of the resurrection and we profess our belief, sometimes we still get confused about how we are to respond and ultimately we go back to the same question; then what?

I have to begin answering this question by returning to the empty tomb and following the example of those who first discovered the tomb was empty. After the angels reminded Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James and the other women that Jesus had risen, Luke's gospel reminds us that they left that tomb changed by the resurrection. They left and shared what they had seen with others. They left the empty tomb and began witnessing to what God had done.

If you are saying to yourself "after all of the Easter celebrations have ended, then what?" let's go back to the empty tomb, follow the example of the first disciples Jesus appeared to after the resurrection, take all we have seen and heard and let's figure out how we are going to share it with others. The disciples went back to their jobs and families and lives and witnessed to the Risen Christ. They lived in the hope and the joy of the resurrection as they told others about this extraordinary gift of God's love as they were going about their ordinary lives.

We are ordinary people with an extraordinary Easter Story to tell. We have the example of the first disciples to follow, so we don't have to sit and wonder as the song says, then what, what you gonna do when the new wears off and the old shines through, because in the Risen Christ all things are made new and that will never get old and it will never wear off!

Through the grace of God, we accept the roles and responsibilities of our calling as disciples of Jesus Christ and trust that God has embraced us with the love, peace, joy and forgiveness of Jesus Christ, our Risen Lord! So let's celebrate the resurrection together and then go out as loved, forgiven and empowered Easter People ready to share all we have seen and heard!

- 1. Our annual BWC Statistics, Annual Personal Property Report to the State of Maryland, W2's, Quarterly Taxes, and end of year reports were all completed in January.
- 2. We are mid-way through our Audit for 2017; am currently waiting for the second round of information requests from the auditor.
- 3. Our year to date budget is on target with a few exceptions due to higher expenses in the winter. Nothing of concern at this point.
- 4. Our Capital Campaign continues in a positive way. And our Building Project is moving forward with real progress you can see. (YEAH!!!)
- 5.
