### From Your Pastor

*Rev. Judy Emerson "Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God." Romans 15:7* 

Have you ever walked into a room full of people and felt as though you were out of place? You just feel uncomfortable and as though you want to get back in your car and go home. This often happens to Pastors when they go to a new church. You serve an appointment for several years and you get to know the congregation. You serve on committees with colleagues in your district and meetings become a homecoming event where you catch up with old friends. Then one day you get "the call". Oh, I'm not talking about God's call in our lives, I'm talking about the life changing call pastors always have in the back of their minds – a call from the District Superintendent saying "*I have an opportunity for you!*" and you find yourself in one meeting after another with people you don't know. We can choose to respond to this type of situation by sitting on the sidelines and checking email or putting in the effort to meet new friends.

Over the past year we've had quite a few new people joining us for worship and events and commenting on our social media pages. The Winfield Community is interested in what's happening at Ebenezer UMC. In other words, we are making an impact. New people are showing up at Ebenezer. The word is getting out that Ebenezer has something exciting going on. The question is, when people come to see what's happening, do they feel part of it? Do they feel welcome?

Summer provides us with an opportunity to reflect on the words of the Apostle Paul when he encouraged the church in Rome to welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you. This is a wonderful time to consider what it means to be Christ-like and welcoming. For some, it may mean approaching someone we do not know and asking his or her name. For others, it could mean giving up that sacred seat we have in the sanctuary and letting a stranger have a seat. As we use the months of July and August to worship together as one congregation, we will have to share our space. In the midst of all the changes we are experiencing with our building project, programs and ministries will continue and God will keep sending us people. Some of them know Christ, others are exploring, and some are showing up because someone else is making them show up. We know how it feels to walk into an unfamiliar space where everyone feels at home except for you. As disciples of Jesus we are called to make everyone feel welcome and at home.

When we began the confirmation process last fall the leaders asked the youth to question their parents and mentors about why they made Ebenezer their church home. More often than not the response was familiar. People made them feel welcome! Someone at Ebenezer invited them or warmly welcomed them and offered a handshake, a hug or a smile and then made a follow-up invitation to come back. Everyone had their own story of how a member in this church made them feel at home.

All of us need to discover our own way of reaching out and embracing others as Christ has embraced us. In the process, I believe we will bring people to Christ, discover some new friends and touch others who need to know God loves them and they have a home at Ebenezer.

May this summer be a time when EUMC rolls out the welcome mat in Jesus' name! Let's take the words of the Apostle to heart when he says: "*Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God!*" *Romans 15:7.*



#### Meet Jan and Brian Connelly

Brian and Jan Connelly first visited Ebenezer on Good Friday 2017 after Jan saw a blurb about the church on the Mount Airy Facebook page.

"Jan's been looking for a place to worship and I wanted to attend worship service with my wife," Brian said. "I think we picked a good place."

Jim and Nancy Huff welcomed the new couple to Ebenezer that Good Friday and helped them with the books they needed for various parts of the service, Brian said.

Brian, who was raised Catholic, attended St. Peter's Catholic Church in Libertytown, where both volunteered, and still do, in a couple of mission projects there. Jan was raised Protestant.

"I really like this church," Jan said.

"I love Judy and want to hear the word of God," Brian said. "Judy is witty and charming, she's great. I feel good when I leave here and I think about what Judy's said."

Brian and Jan said they love the people at Ebenezer – "they're the real deal and so open," Brian said. They also like the small family atmosphere.

"We brought a friend of ours – an ex-nun from St. Peter's – to the spaghetti dinner," Jan said. "She said she could never belong to a church this small and when I asked why, she said, 'You can't lie [about things], you can't hide'!"

Although Brian and Jan have not officially joined Ebenezer yet, they are already involved in a couple of projects. Both help out at the monthly food pantry and are on the church crisis team, as both are in the medical profession. Brian also helped serve communion at the early service May 6.

Jan recently retired after almost 40 years with the state as a pediatric nurse working with emotionally disturbed adolescents. "She's an excellent nurse," Brian said, obviously very proud of her skills. "It takes a special person to work with these kinds of kids."

Brian has worked in the physical therapy field as a P.T.A. for 30 years. Three years ago he co-founded Rebound Physical Therapy in Rockville, where he serves. He hopes to work two or three more years full time, then cut back to part-time, he said.

The couple, who live in Mount Airy, have two daughters. Leah Cole is a lieutenant commander in the Coast Guard stationed with her fellow lieutenant commander husband, Rob Cole, in Hawaii. They have one daughter, Harper, 3 years old. Elizabeth Albrecht lives in Los Angeles and is a buyer for TJ Maxx, flying all over the world looking for furniture for the company, Jan said.

Jan, originally from New York, also has two brothers and two sisters "scattered around the country," she said. Brian's mother is at Lorien in Mount Airy, close to home. He also had a sister who died at age 5 in a swimming pool accident, he said.

Although Brian is still working long hours, the couple go to the gym, like to travel, and do garden and yard work. They're also working on downsizing and cleaning out their home.

"I'm waiting for him to retire so I can play full time," Jan said. They have been to Hawaii to see Leah, but want to go cross country and see more of the U.S. on the way to Los Angeles to see Elizabeth, Brian said. He'd also like to do some international traveling.

The couple are obviously very close after almost 29 years of marriage and family oriented. "We really love each other," Brian said. "We're each other's best friend."


