Just take a look at our new Food Pantry Building. It looks great and the final touches are in progress. It won't be long before we start moving in!

Sunday School Begins: As most of you know, Kim Middleton is our Sunday School Superintendent. She has served in this role before and continues to bring a wealth of experience and knowledge to take us through the many changes we will face this year. Sunday School **begins on September 9, 2018 at 9:45 AM.** We will begin the year in our current building, returning to our regular classrooms. Once we receive the official permit for usage and occupancy of our new Food Pantry Building and we are ready to begin Phase II on the Main Church Building, we will begin to transition to our temporary spaces. If you have questions about our Sunday School Program, please speak with Kim.

Worship Schedule Change: Beginning **Sunday, September 9th**, we are going back to our normal worship schedule, with worship at 8:30 AM and 11:00 AM. It was wonderful to worship together as one congregation this summer. However, it will be good to get back to our normal schedule.

I'm looking forward to another fall season together with some very new and exciting changes and challenges! Thank you all for your continued prayers, support and flexibility. During times when we face changes and challenges it is good to reflect on Proverbs 3:5-6 which says: ***"Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths"***. We, as a community of faith, continue to place our trust in the Lord and we continue to see some amazing things God is doing in and through us each day. It is so exciting to be part of this with you! Our goal for 2019 is to break 30 and we want YOU to join us!

Camp Manidokan offers a wide range of camping opportunities and the activities are endless: hiking, canoeing, rock climbing, horseback riding, swimming, and ropes courses are some of our favorites! Worship around a camp fire, sleep under the stars, and sing along to your favorite Christian hits. Who: YOU! Camps are available for Grades 3-12 (based on grade entering Fall 2019)

Ebenezer's Sunday School Campership Program is back this year. What does that mean? You can earn your camp registration! WHAT?! NO WAY! Here are the deets:

See Julie Partridge and say "Hey, I want to go to camp and I want to earn a campership!" She will have you sign a paper saying that you agree to the rules (eww, rules. I know. But it keeps everyone on the same page.) Here are the rules:

- Come to Sunday School every week from September 9th – May 26th. You MUST initial by your name on the Camp Manidokan bulletin board. You are responsible for reporting your attendance. Not your parents, or your friends, or your teacher. An adult will verify.
- You can miss up to 4 weeks of Sunday School for the year. Why would you miss? Sickness, you forgot to set your alarm clock, vacation... If Sunday School is cancelled for weather or another reason, this will not count against your attendance.
- You can also miss up to 2 weeks of Ebenezer Sunday School, but attend another church's service or Sunday School. How does this work? You MUST bring a bulletin or Sunday School activity signed by that church's Pastor or Sunday School teacher. Give to Julie. Pastor Judy will verify.
- Families will be responsible for the \$100 non-refundable deposit and for registering their campers online. Ebenezer will cover the deposit for any campers or volunteers. Due dates for registration and deposit will be announced soon.
- Campership amount will be limited to the cost of Adventure Camp (less the deposit); families will be required to pay the balance of any specialty camps selected.

Hello Friends,

I pray your summer was FANTASTIC and full of many blessings. Here is some financial information that I thought would be of interest to you:

Thanks to Tony Sager, his helpers, and all those who donated clothing and small household goods, Ebenezer made \$349.40 for the Savers Fun Drive in June. These monies will be used to offset our General Fund. Thanks to Tony for leading this effort and to everyone who helped and participated.

Our Capital Campaign continues to thrive. As of 7/31 we have collected 97.6% of our pledges which equates to \$325,218.00. In addition, we have also received \$142,152.00 of un-pledged monies. The official end date of the campaign is 12/31/18 at which time all pledges should be received. However, we will graciously continue to accept donations towards the Building Project as long as you are willing and able to contribute. Each dollar donated helps to offset the cost of the building and lowers the loan amount. As you can see, our Food Pantry Building is coming right along. We are thankful for all the rain, but it did help to delay the completion. Patience is a virtue!!!

Our Gift Card project has raised \$1,656.69 profit through July. WOW!!! Keep buying those cards and please share the opportunity with your friends and neighbors. If you need help getting started with this effort, please see me or Susan Brown. We would be happy to assist you.

Our regular offering continues on track for the year thanks to your dedicated giving. Offering data is printed each week in the bulletin. Our 2017 Audit was completed successfully and submitted to the Conference. We are now preparing reports for our Charge Conference in September. And as we welcome fall, we are gearing for a very very busy time with lots of areas for you to donate your time and resources. Meet Doug & Cyndi Diethrich

Doug and Cyndi Diethrich are among the many new members Ebenezer has seen come into the church in recent years. Feeling they needed a change after 17 years at the larger Calvary UMC in Mount Airy, a couple of years ago they went looking for a new church home.

“You realize your alignment is off,” Cyndi said. “We were ready to make a change, so we went to several other churches, we did a little church hopping.”

But it was Ebenezer’s congregation that got them to stay. “It’s definitely a good group, they’re so community oriented, good workers, definitely our kind of people,” they both agreed. And they already knew the Streaker family, they said.

And, of course they love Judy. “Judy is great,” Doug said, and Cyndi noted, “She knows us, she has bothered to get to know us, and that means a lot.” Son Austin, 9, added, “She’s funny.”

So, the family joined Ebenezer last year – Doug, Cyndi, and their two sons, Austin and Brian, 15. Previously active in several ministries at Calvary, Doug is already on Ebenezer’s Board of Trustees and plays the guitar when the other instrumentalists play on Sundays. Cyndi leads the middle school youth group. “They’re really a great bunch,” she said. They both also teach a VBS class.

Outside of church, Doug is a mechanic for Montgomery County, working on the ride-on buses. Cyndi is a part-time bookkeeper who works from home. Brian, a sophomore at South Carroll High, plays soccer and is in the Robotics Club. Austin, a fourth-grader at Winfield Elementary, plays lacrosse and soccer and is a bookworm, Cyndi said. “There are stacks of books in his room.”

The couple, married for 23 years, are completely devoted to their sons. “The boys are our life, we follow them to sporting events, they dominate our lives,” Doug and Cyndi said. Cyndi is especially pleased that Austin “has blossomed at Ebenezer, he actually knows more kids here than he did at Calvary, he’s really come out of his shell here.”

Both parents agreed that the change was definitely better for both boys, as well as themselves. “I’ve found some closer friendships here,” Cyndi said. “Cindi Arnold and Angie Grim and I get together for dinner and a chat and it’s really nice.” And Doug has played his guitar a couple of times with Tony Sager’s band, “and that was a lot of fun,” he said.

When time permits, Cyndi likes to read, especially Stephen King, and thrillers, suspense and mysteries. Doug plays, buys, sells and works on guitars, with a collection of some two dozen right now. He played guitar at Calvary for 10 years and has continued playing with a weekly group there, he added.

Two dogs complete the family: Lily, that looks like a Dingo, and Zoey, a Rottweiler, each about 8 years old. Both were adopted from the Carroll County Humane Society, which was VBS’s mission project this year, Cyndi said.

The family also enjoys traveling and has visited numerous state and national parks, including the Grand Canyon, Bryce and Zion, Best Friends Animal Sanctuary, Yosemite, and Sequoia. Yellowstone is on the agenda for next year. The boys even went on an anniversary trip with them to Jamaica three years ago, Doug and Cyndi said.

“We have a good life and we’re happy,” they said. “The boys keep us busy. And the boys and church keep us going.”
