We want to be part of something greater than ourselves where we are looking for a deeper relationship with God. Wherever we are on our journey of faith, we are haunted by the realization that church should be more than the place where we just go on Sundays. The church should help us discern who we are as disciples of Jesus Christ. We get closer to some answers when we start to ask ourselves questions like: Why do I go to church? How do I really follow Jesus? How can I draw closer to God? Where do I even begin to grow spiritually? If we truly want to look out at the world and determine how to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world, we need to start by looking inward. We begin by discerning what it is that we must do for our own spiritual growth.

There are five biblical practices for devoted followers of Jesus: Prayers, presence, service, witness and gifts. It is through these practices that we experience spiritual growth. It is through a persistent pattern of prayer that we grow in our relationship with God and prayer is at the center of everything we say and do. It is by showing up at worship and participating as part of the gathered congregation that we learn to put our words into action. It is in our outreach and service that we are equipped to use the gifts God has given us to participate in God's transforming work. As a disciple of Jesus Christ, we should love people enough to invite them to experience God's love for themselves and accept the call to follow Jesus. How we utilize the gifts we've been given is an important part of our discipleship. It is through the biblical discipline of tithing, giving the first 10% of our income to God's work, that we reach a starting point in a life of generosity.

These are the core practices of discipleship for every follower of Jesus. As we begin our 14th Fall Season together at Ebenezer, I hope all of us will be able to put a check mark by each of the above statements. Ebenezer UMC is an amazing transforming fellowship of faithful disciples. You can't imagine how privileged I feel to be your pastor as together we follow Jesus' call in Matthew 28:19-20 which says: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely, I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Grades 8-9 will meet in the 2nd floor of the Parsonage for Confirmation Class with Rev. Judy and Doug and Cyndi Diethrich.


Grade 10-12 will meet in the 2nd floor Parsonage with Bill Jones.

- You must attend Sunday School every week from September 2019 May 2020
- You may miss up to four weeks of Sunday School
- You may miss an additional two weeks if you attend another church's service or Sunday School and bring a bulletin or Sunday School activity to show your attendance
- If Sunday School is cancelled (i.e., weather), this will not count against your attendance
- If I earn a campership, but do not attend camp, you must reimburse Ebenezer the full value of the campership earned
- Campership amount will be limited to the base cost of camp attendance; you will be responsible for the balance of any specialty camp selected

Parents can let us know any time throughout the school year about events or changes in their student's college life.





Hello Dear Friends.

Welcome back from summer.....I pray your summer was full of memory making activities and that you are rested and ready for a busy fall schedule.

Our audit was completed in June and submitted to the conference ahead of schedule. Our audit report findings stated that we have demonstrated a sound and disciplined approach to maintaining critical checks and balances. The accounting records are well maintained and reflect an ongoing conscientious commitment by church leadership and the treasurer towards accuracy and full transparency. The audit recommended that upon completion of the construction project, the finance team and treasurer will need to review and make appropriate determinations regarding updated assets, depreciation schedules, and related items to make sure that all expenditures are recorded and properly reflected in the financial statement for calendar year 2019. This task may require some help....stay tuned as the Finance team may tag you for assistance.

We continue to be blessed that, even though our Capital Campaign has ended, donations for our building project continue to be received. You can see our Building Project Funding Report in this newsletter. Each dollar donated reduces the amount borrowed on our Line of Credit. Thanks to everyone for their continued support. We also continue to receive profit from our Gift Card project and from the Amazon Smile program. These fund raisers do not cost you anything, but Ebenezer benefits from each and every purchase you make. This year alone our Gift Card project has raised \$1,091.60 and our Amazon Smile has raised \$213.34. Keep buying those Gift Cards and making purchases through Amazon Smile. Feel free to share the opportunity with your friends and neighbors.

Our regular offering continues on a solvent track for the year thanks to your dedicated giving. Offering data is printed each week in the bulletin.

We are now preparing many reports for our Charge Conference in September. 

Meet Charles and Pauline Rosier

Charles and Pauline Rosier are among Ebenezer's newest members. After visiting for several weeks starting in February this year, they liked Pastor Judy and the congregation so much that they promptly joined March 31.

"We've both been Methodists all our lives," Charles said, "and we were looking for a different church. Things were changing in our previous church and it got to the point where we weren't attending."

Feeling the need to get back to church, they made a list of area churches to visit. Ebenezer was at the top of the list. "We went to Ebenezer one Sunday and came out and looked at each other and said 'we'redone" Pauline said. "It's working out well, there's a good feeling about it."

Charles had also been friends with former St. Paul's UMC Pastor Bud Brown, "and I enjoyed his sense of humor, and Judy reminded me of him," he said.

Pauline said they also thought with the new building going up, "it has to be a healthy church. I believe God sent us to Ebenezer."

Both Charles and Pauline grew up in the Gaither area and attended Sykesville High School through ninth grade before finishing up at South Carroll High in 1970. Sweethearts since high school, they married May 26, 1973. "He was the only guy I ever dated," Pauline said.

Still close to where they grew up, the couple live on Fannie Dorsey Road, where they raised two children, Kimberly, 40, and Robert, 37. Kimberly, who has fibromyalgia, and her Plott Hound dog, Ari, live with Charles and Pauline. Robert and his wife Megan live in the Frederick area.

Charles was a volunteer firefighter at Sykesville for some years before joining the Baltimore County Fire Department in 1974. He was a firefighter and apparatus driver/operator, starting out at Towson, then moving to Randallstown, briefly at Chase, then back to Randallstown "four days before the big Amtrak train wreck in 1987," he recalled. He finished up at the Franklin station, retiring Aug. 1, 2007. He still gets together monthly with a group of fellow retired firefighters, he said.

Pauline worked as a secretary at the Carroll County YMCA before moving to Carroll County Bank & Trust as a teller. After the couple started their family, Pauline stayed home to raise the kids, and became involved in school activities with them. Later, when they were grown, she also was a pre-school teacher at Messiah Lutheran Church's pre-school and Early Years Learning Center at Wesley Freedom UM Church, from where she retired the end of May 2007.

Once the kids were grown, Pauline looked for something else to do. Her father was active in the Lions Club, so she joined the Freedom District Lions Club in 1999, serving as president in 2003-2004. She then joined the South Carroll Lioness Lions Club in 2013, serving as president in 2016-2017. She is currently the district chair for the Lions' youth group, LEOs. The LEOs is a youth activities program that encourages community service, and Pauline is actively involved with their programs. "The LEOs is very fulfilling for me," she said. "I love working with kids, from very young to teens."

Pauline is also active in coordinating the Lions' Peace Poster Contest for Sykesville Middle School students, through the youth committee of South Carroll Lioness Lions Club.

For her service, Pauline was named a Melvin Jones Fellow while in the Freedom District Lions, then a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow from the South Carroll Lioness Lions, the highest honor Lions Clubs International gives to a member. Melvin Jones was the founder of the Lions Club International and the couple visited his hometown and memorial in Arizona.

Charles also joined the Freedom District Lions in 2003 as an affiliate member, and continued as an affiliate with the South Carroll Lioness Lions in 2013, where he participates in their fundraising and service projects. The couple was also part of the Taylorsville-Winfield Lions Club from 2011-2013.

The Rosiers also enjoyed camping with their kids when younger, starting out with tents, moving up to a pop-up camper and finally to a 23-foot travel trailer. Camping trips up and down the East Coast included stops at historical sites, as well as the usual tourist places.

"Now we stay in hotels," Pauline said. Trips now are confined to day trips or short overnighters since their daughter's health is fragile and Pauline's aging parents live at Carroll Lutheran Village, where she keeps an eye on them.

Special trips have included cruises to Alaska, a bus trip to Mackinac Island in Michigan, the Rose Bowl Parade, Grand Canyon, and Washington, D.C. to the Law Enforcement and Spy Museum.

At home, Charles plays golf regularly with a group of buddies – "not good, but I have fun," he said.

For now, the couple are getting to know Ebenezer better so one day they can become more involved, as they were in their previous church, where Pauline was on the Administrative Council. "We were asked to be members-at-large of the Administrative Council," Pauline said, "but we turned it down. We weren't ready yet."

As Charles said, "We are fortunate to have done what we have done and are appreciative of what we have. We do plan to get more involved in church."



Christian Appalachian Mountain Project Helping Other People Enthusiastically

The summer of 2019 marked five years for Ebenezer UMC sending youth and adults on this mission project. Five years ago our young people went on a big step of faith when we asked them if they wanted to go and do something serving other people. Ethan, Andrew, JT, and Rachael were among those in that first group, and this year they all graduated and continue to support and reflect on the experiences they had there.

This past summer (2019) <u>22</u> youth and adults went to western Maryland to work on homes in the town of Westernport, MD. Another ten volunteers came on that Tuesday to serve dinner to all the volunteers that were working that week. In October they will be sharing their experiences- date to be determined.

C.A.M.P. H.O.P.E. is a mission work project but it far surpasses that in its experience when you try to explain all that goes into the week. Doing home construction/repairs for individuals or families that just need some extra help and resources. Working alongside friends and leaders from church and accomplishing amazing work. Fellowship in the evenings with the Camp Hope Staff and oh about ninety or so other volunteers from other churches that are there doing the same thing. Participating in vesper services, talents shows, and group activities. Having fun and working hard.

How it Works

We run our scrip program through ShopWithScrip.com, who has worked with over 30,000 nonprofit organizations over the course of 23 years. You can sign up and create an account to order online (Enrollment Code: 5297142A57829) or you can just contact Susan Brown (Stmpnsusan@aol.com) and give her a list of cards you want to order. Orders are placed weekly or bi-weekly depending upon how many orders are received.

Many Hands Make Quick Work


