



Meet Karl & Nicole Streaker

Like many newer members of Ebenezer, Karl and Nicole Streaker were shopping for a new church that was compatible with their lives – smaller, so they could get to know other members and feel more connected; closer to home; and with families with children to make friends with their own kids.

The Streakers moved to the Mount Airy area in 2005 from Frederick County. Karl was an Assistant Principal at Sykesville Middle and Nicole was a stay-at-home mother to their two young children, William and Hannah. They continued to attend Calvary United Methodist in Frederick until they found a new church home in the Spring of 2010. They had already checked out a couple of nearby churches when Nicole, teaching at Freedom Elementary, asked fellow teacher Carolene Will, what church she attended.

"There's a lot of familiarity here," Karl said. "The kids know some other kids from school, and I grew up in Taylorsville, so I knew some people here. The church is so friendly and welcoming." Nicole added, "We came from a large church and we never felt as connected as we had hoped. There was a change in pastors and things became different." Things changed even more in 2009 for Nicole, who had been raised Jewish. The couple attended Karl's home church, Grace Lutheran, after they met. When the couple married in 1996, they had an interfaith wedding and began to attend Calvary United Methodist Church in Frederick. But on Jan. 19, 2009, "a prominent member of the church, Lori Shipley, died in a car accident," Karl said. The couple attended the funeral, and Nicole's life was changed. "I never felt like an outcast [at church], but that funeral was where it hit me what a church family really is, the way they supported the family," Nicole said. "After that funeral I told Karl 'I'm ready to become a Christian'." Which she did that Mother's Day, May 10, 2009. A year later, the family joined Ebenezer.

Karl and Nicole right away become involved in church activities. She helps with the food pantry, VBS, volunteered at Camp Manidokan, organizes the CAMP HOPE dinner, attends the Women's Retreat, and was Holly Mart chair one year, and still helps out there. He is on the Staff Parish Committee, serves as an adult leader with CAMP HOPE, and has been on Administrative Council and Finance Committee. They both have helped with youth group and with trips to ROCK. "We help out with church things, whatever comes up," they said. Both are educators. Karl first taught in Frederick County, left teaching to work as a software trainer and in insurance before going back to teaching in Frederick County. Here in Carroll County, he has been assistant principal at Sykesville and West Middle schools, principal at Mount Airy Middle and briefly at West Middle before being appointed to the Director of Student Services for the county public school system last February. Nicole taught pre-K in Baltimore County for one year and kindergarten in Frederick County for seven years before taking off seven years to raise William and Hannah. She returned to teaching in 2009 as a kindergarten teacher at Freedom Elementary where she is starting her 11th year. Upon joining Ebenezer, William and Hannah sang in the youth choir, attended Manidokan and

they attended and still help with Vacation Bible School. They are both involved in CAMP HOPE; Hannah helps with the dinner and William is part of the mission team. Both Hannah and William have enjoyed attending ROCK in Ocean City and help with Holly Mart.

William, 16, is a junior at South Carroll High, and is in the drama club, band and chorus, playing piano and singing. He has played piano since age 4, started lessons at 5, and has played piano and sang at church.

Besides his amazing piano work, he also has perfect pitch, meaning "I can hear a certain tone, and copy it," he said. "He can hear a song, then go play it without reading the music," Nicole said. His keen ability enables him to play a wide genre of music. Last year, he joined the church adult choir and enjoys the time with the group! William also works at Weis markets in Mount Airy and just got his driver's license in early September.

Hannah, 14, is a freshman at South Carroll, and helps with the drama programs by using her art skills on the sets. She loves all sports mascots. Nicole and Hannah both volunteer at the Carroll County Humane Society, where they clean the cat cages and play with the cats that are up for adoption. When Hannah was 4, Nicole started donating Hannah's hair to an organization that provides hair for those in need. Hannah now donates her hair on her own, which she has done six times. Hannah also swims and goes to an exercise class with Nicole at the YMCA. This year, Hannah will take confirmation classes at Ebenezer.

Rounding out the family is Disney, an 8-year-old brown and white cat adopted from the Humane Society.

Aside from work and church, Karl enjoys sports, and Nicole runs and enjoys reading and both stress family time with the kids.
