As I look back to the beginning of last year's season of Advent, we were finishing up the final touches on our building construction. I was recovering from having both knees replaced and we were preparing for our move out of the parsonage. Our focus and our energy remained on completing the building and how we would use this incredible place for ministry. It was a crazy and exciting time of expectation. As I look back, I am so thankful at how well our congregation worked together, adapted and remained flexible throughout the entire process. Now, a year later, we have a beautiful new building, my knees are much better and God has blessed us with an abundance of hope and expectation for how we can serve.

None of us anticipated being faced with a pandemic that would keep us from fully using this new space. I believe we have all done our best to be flexible and adapt to our challenging circumstances as we have continued to serve through the ministries of the church in new ways. We were blessed to celebrate our new building with a wonderful open house and worship celebration in March of 2020 before locking the building due to a pandemic. In the midst of Covid-19 we were still able to rejoice and celebrate the sacrament of baptism and holy communion this year. We received new members into our community of faith this summer. We also grieved the loss of beloved members, remembering and celebrating their lives. We had the joy of confirming 13 youth in a unique way. None of these events occurred as we would have wanted them to happen because of the limitations of the coronavirus. Yet we still adapted and worked together. We continued to be a community of faith in ministry together, we continued to be the church. Our church was never closed! We simply found new ways to worship, study and serve. Jesus tells us we are to "make disciples" and "be witnesses to the truth to the ends of the earth". There is nothing unique about this as a priority, but what is unique is how we respond in the midst of our unexpected limited circumstances right now.

Advent is a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Christ at Christmas and the return of Christ at the Second Coming. At the heart of Christmas is the simple truth that God comes to meet us in Jesus Christ. In coming into our lives Christ saves us from sin and death by reconciling us to God. At the heart of Advent is the expectation of Jesus' coming ... and our watchful, hopeful, waiting for his appearing. So, as you look forward to this season, rather than thinking about what we cannot do together, I ask that you consider how God is preparing you for the arrival of the Christ Child. Keep awake and alert for signs of God's kingdom. Keep faith in God's presence in all situations. Keep hope that God brings good out of darkness. At the same time though, expect to be surprised by the unexpectedness of this gift and open your hearts and minds to all God has in store for you in the coming year.

I pray we will all have a healthy, happy and faith-filled Advent and Christmas Season as we approach the new year together. May we see an end to Covid-19 soon trusting that whatever 2021 may bring, God is with us!

## Treasurer's Tidbits



Well 2020 continues to be a challenging and busy year. And we continue to be amazingly blessed by the generosity and dedication of this congregation. Through your offerings, your support of the fundraisers, and gift card purchases, our budget is in good shape. As of the writing of this message, our financial status is on target to show expenses under budget and income over budget. We have had many areas of expenses that have come in under budget due to the decrease in building usage, less supplies needed, and not as many activities during the year. However, we have had other areas requiring increased spending due to the pandemic, i.e., hand sanitizer machines, masks, thermometers, hand sanitizer liquids, etc.

- --Our Fundraisers (in lieu of our cancelled Holly Mart) have been a huge success. Starting with the Jams & Jellies, Joe Corbis, Rada Knives, Pies/Cakes/Dumplings, crafts (scrubbies/greeting cards) and now the Cookies & Candy, we are on target to profit over \$5,000. Final tallies will be available after all fundraisers are completed and expenses paid. Thanks to everyone who supported these efforts by purchasing items, donating monies, or making these goodies. Even in a Covid environment, we were able to safely offer these events.
- --Our Amazon Smile profits to date for 2020 equals \$414 and our Gift Card Profit to date for 2020 equals \$1,843. Thank you for your continued support of these programs as these profits contribute towards our LOC expense.
- --I have been in touch with PNC bank and we are still waiting for our invitation to apply for forgiveness of our PPP loan. Due to many changes to the PPP Program, the on-line software is continually changing, and this in turn delays our ability to submit our paperwork for the forgiveness. I'll update you on this program again at Planning Day in January.
- --I will be working on closing the books for 2020, preparing reports for years end, and setting up the system for 2021. This information will be presented at the Planning Day in January.
- --After our message in the last newsletter, I have seen an increase in giving using the Online Bill Pay. Just as a reminder, this is an easy way to send in your offering without having to mail your offering, or drop it by church, or even remembering to do it. You can establish Ebenezer as a vendor in your bank's Bill Pay system and schedule a regular payment at whatever frequency you choose. There is no charge to you for this service and Ebenezer does not incur any fees. You don't even need a stamp. If you have any questions or need help setting this up, please contact me and I'll be happy to help.
- --Our Charge Conference was very different from prior years. Through ZOOM, there were 55 participants and a very good message from J.W. Parks, District Superintendent. All of our documents were submitted and approved during this zoom meeting.

# Come One – Come All! Administrative Council Annual Planning Day! Saturday, January 9, 2021 9:00 AM to 12:00 Noon



### CHANGES TO THE COLD WEATHER SHELTER PROGRAM IN WESTMINSTER

In recent years, the Cold Weather Shelter opened November 15th and then closed on or about March 31st every year, and Ebenezer has been one of the community groups to provide and serve dinner 1 night per month.

Beginning this winter, operations have been extended around the clock for 6 months October 1<sup>st</sup> through March 31<sup>st</sup>. In addition the shelter has moved to a new space, in the basement of St. Paul's United Church of Christ, 17 Bond St., Westminster.

Ebenezer is still providing dinner the 3rd Sunday of each month. In a change from past practices driven by COVID, we are preparing covered dishes of food and/or trays of individually wrapped items and bringing them to the church where CWS staff do the serving.
