



At this age, having someone to love and take care of him can mean the difference between life and death. That's why your sponsorship provides a trained Survival Specialist from his local church to visit him every month at home.

These Specialists provide access to much-needed immunizations and medical care, as well as food and water to meet critical physical needs. They also lend emotional and spiritual support to family members committed to caring for him. Your sponsorship allows Liam a strong, healthy start, early in life when it can have the biggest impact. His Christian activities include attending Sunday School & church. His favorite activity at the Compassion project is spending time with friends.

Greetings to Everyone:

As discussed at our Planning Day, our 2020 budget year ended very well. Even with the Covid crisis, again our income was more than anticipated and our expenses came in under budget. The attached charts were discussed at Planning Day and show our status at the end of 2020 and our approved budget for 2021. We are still awaiting instruction from PNC regarding our PPP loan. If you have any questions about our finances, please do not hesitate to contact me or Tina our Finance Chair. Thanks to everyone for your financial dedication to so many of God's mission here at Ebenezer.

Your generous giving supported many underprivileged families and those in need through our Additional Outreach, Cold Weather Shelter, Food Pantry, ESCAPE lunches, Christmas Families, etc. Looking forward to another positive year in 2021

The second attachment gives a quick overview of the Building Project and how we ended that project financially. As Tina discussed at Planning Day, we ended the project without using the full amount of our Line of Credit (LOC). Tina and the Finance Team will be looking to convert our line of credit (LOC) into a mortgage soon. Our current LOC and CD rates are still considered very good in the current market.

Our Fund-Raising efforts were very different in 2020, but still profitable. Our "in lieu of" Holly Mart netted \$6,443 which was split between the Scholarship Fund (25%) the Building Fund (\$25%) and the General Fund (50%). The Holly Mart included jams/jellies/salsa; pies/cakes/dumplings; and cookies and candies. Update on Capital Campaign

We received pledges for \$333,344 but the actual pledges paid were \$338,675. We have also received un-pledged donations totaling \$305,097. Bringing our total Capital Campaign donations to \$643,772 to date.

We currently continue to receive regular donations even after the Campaign concluded. Each and every donation goes towards payment of our Line of Credit. And eventually, when we convert the LOC to a mortgage, we will use the donations towards paying down that mortgage.
