They are now working on providing additional parking on the back hill. We are in the process of gathering estimates with the hope of expanding our parking in the next few months.

Parents can let us know any time throughout the school year about events or changes in their student's college/ other life.






#### MEALS FOR DAY-BY-DAY SHELTER

It does not follow the same order or reproduce the same stories as the synoptic gospels. To a much greater degree, it is the product of a developed theological reflection and grows out of a different circle and tradition.

Greetings Friends,

The finances of the church, as we continue to serve our Lord in a Covid environment, are doing well. I continue to pray that all of our congregation and their family and friends stay healthy and safe.

Below is some information on where we are at this point financially and what we have accomplished and what we are currently working on.

- --Our audit report was completed and submitted to the Conference successfully in June. As David Rapids shared with us recently, I can put a check on my checklist for the 2020 audit. As a requirement in our audit report, I continue to work with my team of experts on getting our Capital Projects depreciation schedule set up and tracking inside of our financial system. Our goal is to have all this information loaded and tracking by year's end.
- --Donations for our building project continue to be received. Each dollar donated helps to make our monthly payments on the outstanding loan. Many thanks to everyone for their continued support. We also continue to receive profit from our Script Gift Card project and from the Amazon Smile program. These fund raisers do not cost you anything, but Ebenezer benefits from each and every purchase you make. To date this year, our Gift Card project has raised \$1,268 and our Amazon Smile has raised \$261. Keep buying those Gift Cards and making purchases through Amazon Smile. Feel free to share the opportunity with your family, friends and neighbors. And if you need information on how to use these programs, please see me or Susan Brown. We are happy to help.
- --Thanks to our dedicated givers, our regular offering continues to be received on a regular basis. We receive our offerings on Sunday mornings, through the mail, and also many automatically through the Bill Pay process at your banks.

Here is our information as of **Aug 22, 2021**.

Actual offering & non-offering income to date is: \$179,411

Actual Expenses to date are: \$161,013

Budgeted (projected) Expenses to year's end: \$92,923

Budgeted (projected) offering & non-Offering to year's end: \$78,039

- --We are currently preparing many reports and gathering information for our Charge Conference in September. All information is due to the Conference by September 10.
- --Our Finance Committee met in July with our representative from Schwab Investments. After that meeting, the committee made several decisions regarding slight changes to our cash holdings. Our investment accounts are doing well in the current markets.
- -- Tina and I are working on gathering estimates from different banking institutions on mortgage offerings as we look to convert our Line of Credit to a mortgage.
- --The Winfield Branch of PNC is closing, and we will be using the Eldersburg Branch as of September 17, 2021. We are currently looking at other banks in the area to gather information on whether we stay with PNC or move to another banking facility. Stay tuned for more information on this topic.
- -- We are looking forward to having our Holly Mart November 13th at the Winfield Fire Hall. Income from this event is used to support several areas in our church in addition to the general fund. As always, we will watch the status of Covid and how it might affect these events. Stay tuned for updates as the date gets closer.
- --It seems a ways away, but just a **Save the Date**....Ebenezer Christmas Dinner in our new Fellowship Hall on December 4, 2021. More details to follow.....
