A Message from Your Pastor

As we approach Thanksgiving Day most of us will be sharing expressions of gratitude with friends and family. There are times in life when words of thanksgiving come rather easily. There are other times when words of praise and thanksgiving seem difficult. In these moments, I find myself giving thanks for how God is with me during all seasons and experiences.

Ebenezer's annual Holly Mart is almost here and shortly after we will be amid Advent and Christmas. Sometimes different words get associated with the four weeks before Christmas that we know as Advent:

Hope — The Christian virtue of hope is about much more than just a positive feeling. It is rooted in a confidence that God is with us, that he always has been with us, and he always will be with us. We can look back and remember the times when God brought light and new life. As we live in a dark and frightening world, we light the candle of Hope.

Peace — What robs us of our peace is not so much the death of a loved one, job loss, busyness, economic uncertainty, discouraging news stories, or the weight of responsibilities. It is thinking that I have to figure it out, I must make it work and I'm just not able to. When we remember that God is with us, we also realize that we can let God do the heavy lifting if I do my part. That realization allows us to light the candle of peace.

Joy — Joy isn't something we find, make, or keep; it's something that finds us. As you go about your day doing the small part that God asks of you, you will find joy in your life. It comes from the answered prayers, the moments of love, and the flashes of gratitude. We light the candle of joy, the pink one, with the realization that God has even greater joys planned for us.

Love —The theme of love fills our Christmas season. Jesus focused on preaching love throughout his ministry. Two of his greatest commands involve love: Love God, love your neighbor (*Matthew 22:36-40*). Love is the greatest of all the virtues on the Advent Wreath and encompasses Jesus' entire purpose for being on earth. The candle of Love is all encompassing.

No matter our personal traditions, we can trust that virtues such as hope, peace, joy, and love are important in the Christmas story as well as in our daily walk with Christ. May we be a people of hope, peace, joy and love that rejoices in the light that Christmas brings. I pray that you and your family will have a Blessed Christmas, and a grace filled New Year.

Here are ways you can still help to make this event a success:




