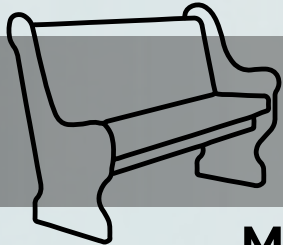

MEET GARY AND VICKI KRETSCHMER

Gary and Vicki Kretschmer joined Ebenezer in June 2024 after visiting off and on for several years. "The first time we came with Byron and Judy Ricketts from Calvary United Methodist in Mount Airy," Gary said. "We liked the church, it's open and very welcoming. We like the people in the church and wanted a small church. So, we decided to come, met with Judy, and joined." Vicki added, "We really like Judy. She talks about things you can apply to daily life and you don't have to be a Bible scholar to understand." Since then, Gary has been named to the Board of Trustees, helps with the food pantry, and joined C.R.E.W. in June.

The couple met in high school in Parkville, where they both grew up. Gary (whose real name is Gerhart, but he prefers Gary) came from a large family of six kids with parents who were involved in church. During the wrestling season, the Junior Varsity matches were first and the Varsity team would watch from the bleachers. It was during one of these matches that Vicki caught his eye. He asked his friend who she was and they then sat behind her. Vicki remembers "they sat behind me and made snarky remarks." Gary was immediately smitten and decided that she was the girl he wanted to spend his life with. Later, after a trip to the local Gino's for hamburgers, they dated for four years and married at his family's church, St. John's Lutheran Church of Parkville, in 1977. They bought their first house, a row home in Baltimore City, where they lived for 10 years before escaping city life for more rural Mount Airy. By that time, Vicki, who had taken riding lessons, had two horses, so they found a 5+ acre plot, bought it and built a house and barn. The large property also gave their pet dog at the time space to run.

Gary worked a variety of jobs for six years after high school before being hired by BGE, where he stayed for 38 years before retiring. Vicki worked for Hartford Insurance for 18 years, then took off to have their daughter, Samantha. She later served as director of Children's Ministries at Calvary UMC for 19 years. She currently works three days a week at Health Unlimited in Mount Airy as a group fitness instructor. The couple are close to Samantha, who bought a row home in Mount Airy. "She's close to us so she can call at midnight if something needs to be fixed," Gary joked. Samantha graduated from South Carroll High School, then the University of Maryland as a mechanical engineer. The only woman engineer in her department, Gary noted, she works for the Department of Defense.

With their animals now gone and free to travel, Gary said, "We're Disney fanatics. We took our honeymoon there when it was just the Magic Kingdom Park at Disney World, then it took us three years to save enough money to go back. Since then we've watched it grow into what it is now." They later bought into the Disney Vacation Club and return twice a year now for vacation. In the past, they've done cruises, visited Yellowstone National Park, and this past June went to Florida for the Orioles' spring training and to visit a friend's summer home on a small island near Sarasota.

At home, Gary has a model train collection that includes steam engines in gauges HO, Standard, and Lionel to G scale. The G-scale was large enough to put outside in the yard until they put an addition on their house, he said. Even though he can't play the sports he used to, he still loves watching football games on TV, and listening to the Orioles on the radio so he can work on a project during the game. He also likes reading westerns and thrillers. A reader since she was young, then worked in the high school library, Vicki enjoys reading a variety of fiction.

"She comes home from the library with a sackfull of books at a time," Gary said. "I ask her, did you leave any on the shelves?"

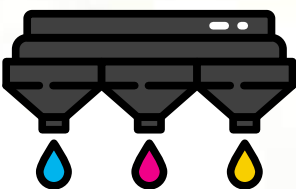
Join Rev. Rick Gray weekly to discuss the Corinthian Letters and how they can be applied to present day. This is always a fun, informative time to be together!
